

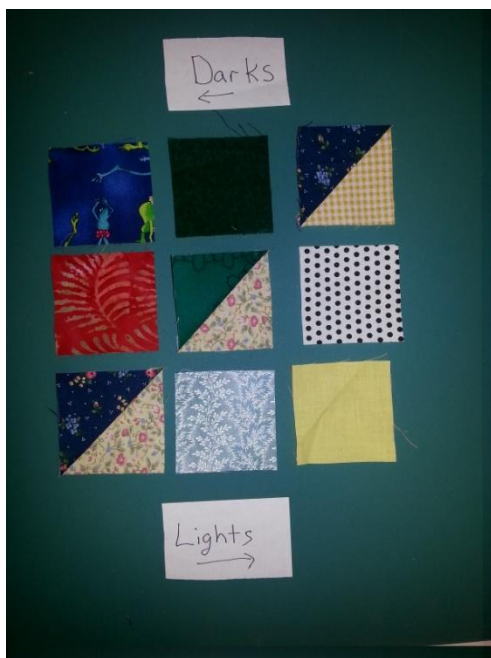
OCQG Block of the Month  
AUGUST 2015  
Split Nine-Patch

Cut:

- 3—2 ½" squares of any different dark fabrics
- 3—2 ½" squares of any different light fabrics
- 2—2 7/8" squares of different dark fabrics
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Cut all 2 7/8" squares once on the diagonal. You will need 3 of these triangles of dark and 3 of these triangles of light for one block. Sew together 1 dark and 1 light triangle to form a square that should measure 2 ½". Press seams to the dark fabric. Make 3 of these. (Hint: use the extra pieces for your next block!!)

Place your squares and half-square triangle pieces in the arrangement below:



Sew first row together, press to the right. Sew second row together, press to the left. Sew third row together, press to the right. Sew these rows together press toward both seams in one direction.

Your block should look light on one diagonal half and dark on the other diagonal half.  
Finished block should measure 6 ½" square.

Put your name in the drawing once for each block turned in.
