

OCQG Block of the Month
April 2018

9" Purple Tulips Block



For each block, cut:

One 10" square of cream background fabric
One leaf and two stems of green fabric
Two tulips of different purple fabrics
(Appliqué patterns are on next page – dotted line indicates seam line.)

Block adapted from Mini Quilts From Traditional Designs, by Adele Corcoran and Caroline Wilkinson.

To make the block:

Machine Appliqué Method:

Trace shapes onto the paper side of fusible web, remembering to mirror the image. If desired, trim out center to reduce stiffness of block. Iron fusible web onto the wrong side of the fabrics. Cut out shapes and remove the paper backing. Place on background fabric, layering the stems under the leaf and flowers, and one flower atop the other. Iron to affix, then stitch to secure, using whatever stitch you prefer. Press. Trim block to 9 ½" square.

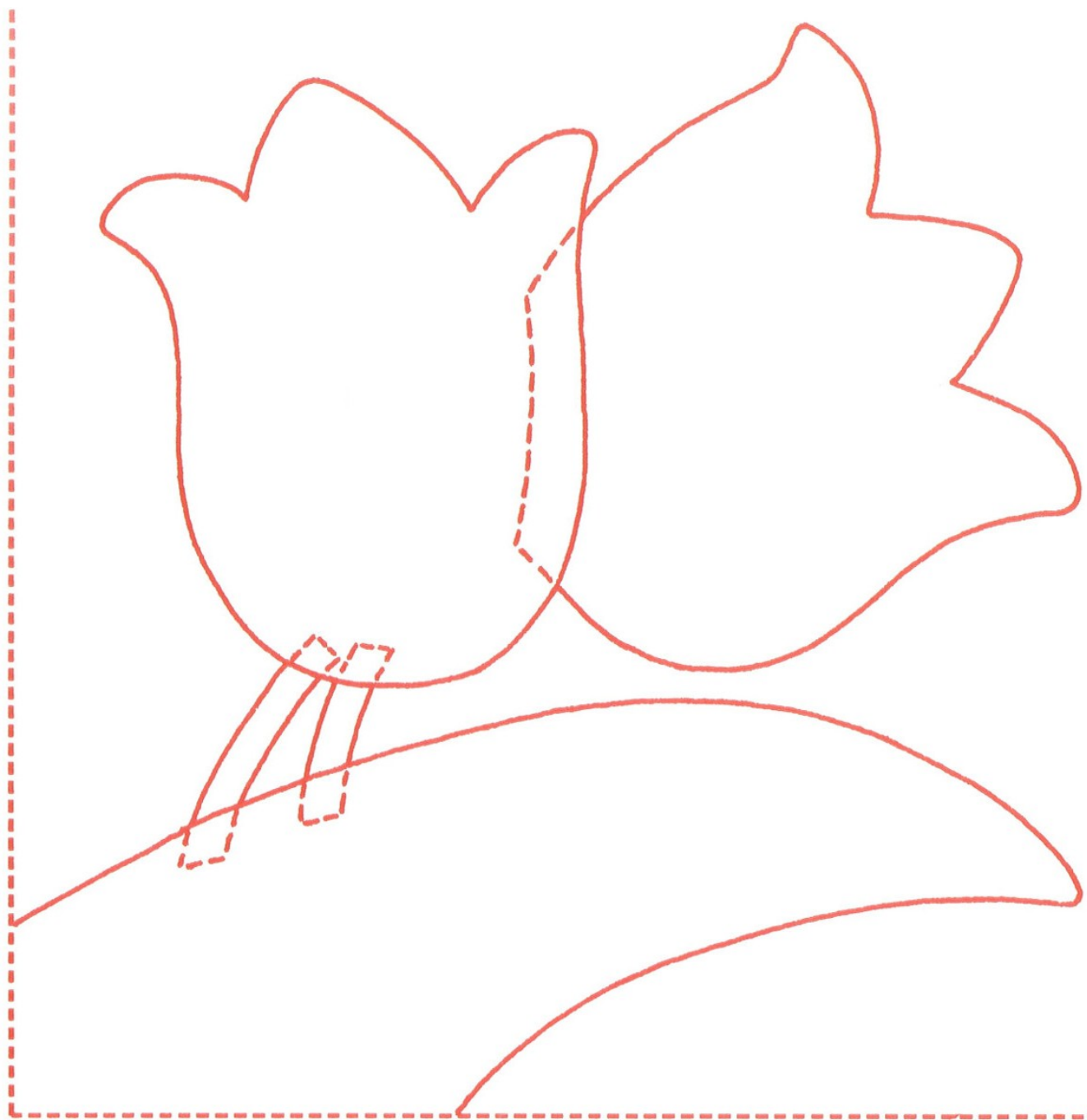
Hand Appliqué Method:

Trace shapes onto the right side of your fabrics. Cut out, being sure to add your desired seam

allowance. Place on background fabric, layering the stems under the leaf and flowers, and one flower atop the other. Turning under seam allowance, stitch to secure, using whatever sewing or embroidery stitch you prefer. Press. Trim block to 9 ½” square.

Put your name in the drawing once for each block turned in (maximum of five).
