


October Block of the Month 2014 Blue and Green Triangles and Squares

For EACH 8-1/2" block you will need:


- One 8-7/8" square of medium-to-dark blue or green fabric (can be print, batik, blender, or solid). Cut this square on one diagonal, forming 2 triangles. Set one triangle aside for a bonus project.* The other triangle will be your "A" piece for your block.
- One 4-1/2" square of medium-to-dark blue or green fabric (can be print, batik, blender, or solid). This will be your "B" piece for your block.
- One 4-7/8" square of cream fabric (can be tone-on-tone, solid, or a shirting that "reads" cream and goes with the blue and green color scheme in a subtle way). You will need to cut this square on one diagonal, making two "C" triangles for your block.

Assemble using 1/4" seams as follows:


1. Sew one short side of a C triangle to one side of the B square. Press the seam allowance toward the square.



2. Sew one short side of the other C triangle to the adjacent side of the B square. Press the seam allowance toward the square.



3. Pin the A triangle to the B and C unit, right sides together, along the long side of the triangle, being careful not to stretch the bias edges. Sew, and press the seam allowance toward the A triangle. Trim to 8-1/2" square, and you are finished!



* BONUS: If you make five different blocks, you will have five EXTRA "A" triangles. If you bring those to the October meeting, along with your five blocks, you will get a ticket for a bonus drawing to win all the extra "A" triangles that are turned in! The lucky winner of the triangles will have a good start on a scrappy triangle and square quilt top!
