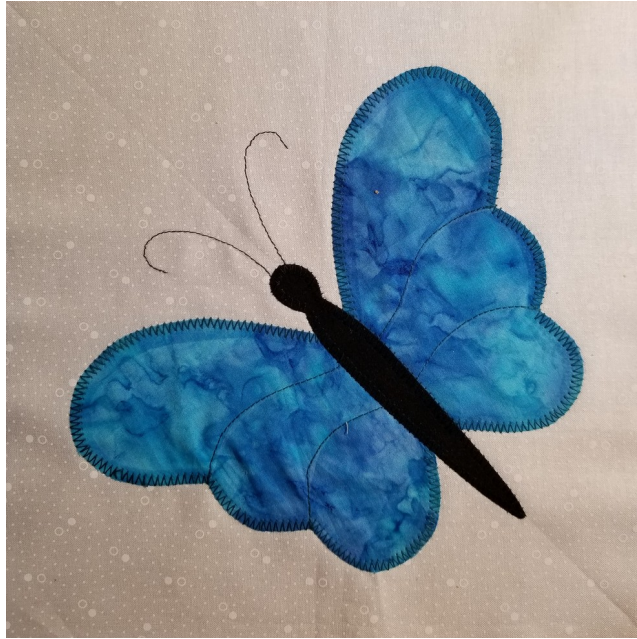


OCQG Block of the Month
November 2018

9” Beautiful Batik Butterfly Block



For each block, cut:

One 10” square of cream background fabric
One butterfly wings (piece A on pattern) of batik fabric
One butterfly body (piece B on pattern) of black fabric
(Appliqué patterns are on next page – dotted lines indicate optional embroidery lines.)

To make the block:

Machine Appliqué Method:

Trace shapes onto the paper side of fusible web. If desired, trim out center to reduce stiffness of block. Iron fusible web onto the wrong side of the fabrics. Cut out shapes and remove the paper backing. Diagonally finger-press the background and use that line to place the shapes, layering the butterfly body over the wings. Iron to affix, then stitch to secure, using whatever stitch you prefer. Stitch wing and antennae detail lines. Press. Trim block to 9 ½” square.

Hand Appliqué Method:

Trace shapes onto the right side of your fabrics. Cut out, being sure to add your desired seam allowance. Diagonally finger-press the background and use that line to place the shapes, layering the butterfly body over the wings. Turning under seam allowance, stitch to secure, using whatever stitch you prefer. Stitch wing and antennae detail lines. Press. Trim block to 9 ½” square.

Put your name in the drawing once for each block turned in (maximum of five).
